ANNUAL REPORT 2015

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1. Introduction

PlanetRomeo Foundation hereby presents its 2015 annual report, a year in which we look back with pride. We funded a total of €143,631 to 34 LGBTI projects around the world, almost 50% more as compared to 2014. This makes the Foundation Board proud and even more determined to continue our efforts to fund small LGBTI initiatives. The contribution we make to the lives of LGBTI people around the world is real and needed. We make a difference, but we cannot do so without our donators. The board would therefore also extend its immense gratitude to all who helped to make this possible.

In 2015, the Foundation Management Board again paid attention to achieving an increased number of funding requests as well as a higher quality level, while also ensuring a balanced regional coverage. With regard to the internal organization, the Foundation Board conducted an analysis of the Safety & Shelter projects funded, and made further improvements to procedures and forms. Also, several networking activities were undertaken. More information on these subjects, as well as an overview of all supported projects can be found in chapter 3.

2. Vision, Mission and Priority Themes

2.1 PlanetRomeo Foundation

PlanetRomeo Foundation was established in 2009 as an independent, registered non-profit. Its founder and main supporter is PlanetRomeo BV, the company behind planetromeo.com, one of the largest gay dating and social platforms in the world. The Foundation allows PlanetRomeo the opportunity to combine the power of its online community with the fight for LGBTI equal rights and opportunities.

2.2 Vision and Mission

PlanetRomeo Foundation envisions a world without discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation or gender identity; a world in which lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex people have the same rights and opportunities as anyone else; a world which values and respects differences in sexual orientation, gender identity and expression.

The Foundation aims to realize this vision by supporting projects under 3 priority themes that focus on achieving societal change in order to improve the position of LGBTI people throughout the world, with emphasis on the most disadvantaged regions and LGBTI communities.

2.3 Priority Themes

PlanetRomeo Foundation supports projects and initiatives under the following themes:

Safety & Shelter

Every day all around the world members of the LGBTI community suffer from bullying, discrimination, exclusion, violence, imprisonment or even execution. Homosexuality is still criminalized in over eighty countries. PlanetRomeo Foundation supports projects that provide shelter and a safe haven for LGBTI people, especially in countries and regions where their safety and wellbeing are most at stake.

Education

Educating people and making them aware of their rights is the key towards achieving better and equal opportunities in life. Awareness raising projects and initiatives which aim at increasing support for the LGBTI community among fellow (straight) citizens and policy/decision makers can also be eligible for funding. Furthermore the Foundation takes interest in projects that aim for achieving a more LGBTI inclusive school climate.

Sports & Culture

PlanetRomeo Foundation perceives sports & culture as means to make a difference in other aspects and areas of people's lives. Projects and initiatives within this theme are only eligible for funding in countries or regions where they play a distinctive role in mobilizing, connecting and strengthening the local, disadvantaged LGBTI community or making this community more visible.

3. Activity Overview

3.1 Networking Activities

In 2015, PlanetRomeo Foundation enhanced its presence among other funding organizations in order to make the Foundation name more well-known.

The Foundation's Chair, Karen Kraan, attended an international LGBTI funders meeting in Athens, Greece, to connect with representatives of other LGBTI funding organizations. This not only confirmed that the Foundation has become a familiar name among other organizations, but also that the Foundation has an important role to play. The combination of funding small initiatives and having relatively straightforward procedures, makes certain that the Foundation serves as an important stepping stone to other sources of funding. Our international scope, as well as our choice in priority themes, are appreciated and perceived as special. This is a confirmation of our distinct position as a 'small big funder' within the LGBTI funding landscape.

In May 2015, PlanetRomeo Foundation initiated a meeting with other internationally operating Dutch LGBTI funding organizations, which was held in Amsterdam. Participating funding organizations included Mama Cash, The Pride Fonds (a joint initiative of Amnesty International & COC Netherlands), Trut Fund and XminY Solidarity Fund.

During this meeting, information on the organization's individual funding strategies was exchanged, and we determined what the overlap and differences between them were. Also, expert knowledge was shared and decided to make it possible to redirect funding applications to each other.

3.2 Fundraising Activities

It was determined that the current donation options, both via the Foundation website and via planetromeo.com were in need of further improvement and optimization. For example, recurring donation options as well as making multiple local payment options should be made available. These are expected to increase the potential success of a fundraising campaign. The development of both the new donate page and the campaign itself were started early 2016, and due for launch later in the year.

3.3 Strategic Focus Development

Renewed effort has been made to further ensure a balance between the number and quality of funding requests received and the project funding granted. To achieve this, the Management Board members distributed an e-brochure among their international network of LGBTI advocacy and funding organizations, as well as to other relevant stakeholders. Also, an analysis was conducted on all of the final reports of previously supported Safety & Shelter projects. As these projects often meet with specific challenges, a more in depth analysis was conducted in order to get a better understanding of both their context and conditions of these projects, as well as better ways to monitor them.

3.4 2015 Project Overview

In 2015, a total of 151 funding requests have been received, an increase of more than 60% as compared to 2014. Of these 151 requests, 104 were rejected because they did not match with the below mentioned criteria. At the end of 2015, 13 funding requests were still pending.

“For the Community, By the Community” is a core concept for PlanetRomeo Foundation. In supporting brave, small-scale, community based projects the Foundation strives for a good balance between accessibility, quality and maintaining a standard in project accountability. In assessing funding requests the Foundation board is guided by the following criteria:

- The extent to which project proposals meet PlanetRomeo Foundation’s vision, mission and goals of PlanetRomeo Foundation.
- The extent to which they contribute to the priority themes.
- The expected regional impact of the initiative and the extent to which the project aims to involve; mobilize and activate the community.
- The solidity of the project layout.
- A fair balance between the amount of funding requested and expected project results.
- Preference for small-scale, emerging, grassroots projects.
- Preference for organizations or projects that have either less or no access at all to mainstream sources of funding.
- Projects should complement existing or earlier activities.
- To achieve a balanced spread of the funding available over the priority themes and across regions in the world.

While the Foundation prioritizes projects in countries and continents where it is needed most, we have funded projects all over the world, because in most countries LGBTI (sub)groups need support. In 2015, 34 projects have been supported for a total amount of € 143,631 funded:

3.5 Organizational Developments

Report from the Management Board

In 2015, the Management Board maintained a regular frequency of meetings to safeguard the further development of the organizational structure, policy and strategy of the Foundation. The board met 11 times in 2015.

Nori Spauwen, Junior Diplomat, working on conflict prevention and mediation at the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and Niels Kattenberg, Fundraising Consultant at Nassau Fundraising, were appointed to the Management Board late 2015. The Supervisory Board also extended the term of appointment of Renate Hartman and Jan Bouwens. At the end of 2015, the Management Board consisted of 6 members.

Report from the Supervisory Board

Preceding the Supervisory Board meetings, the board members conducted preparatory activities. The board convened three times in 2015. All meetings were joined by the Management Board, in which the 2015 budget and the 2014 annual account were adopted. Additionally, the Supervisory Board was informed about policy and strategic developments, consistent with its supervisory task.

Mid-2015, Michèl Tromp decided not to extend his appointment as chair, Janneke Harting took over this role. At the end of 2015, the Supervisory Board consisted of 3 members.

Project funding

A total of € 143,631 was spent on project funding. All funding was granted based on funding requests submitted to the Foundation. Please see chapter 3.4 for an overview.

During 2015, a few payment installments for projects supported in previous years were cancelled, due to projects being finished with less expense than previously budgeted for, or projects that didn't meet their original project goals. This led to a release of funding obligations over previous years in the amount of € 11,150.

Overhead and service agreement

The asset management of PlanetRomeo Foundation is in line with both the guidelines for Dutch registered non-profit organizations (*ANBI*) and those set by the Dutch Central Bureau of Fundraising (*Centraal Bureau Fondsenwerving*). This implies, among other things, that the total cost the Foundation incurs for carrying out its objectives, does not exceed a quarter of its annual income.

PlanetRomeo BV also makes an annual in kind donation for the services they provide to PlanetRomeo Foundation. This is set in a so-called Service Agreement. These services include the provision of staff, office space and inventory. This allows PlanetRomeo Foundation to maintain its overhead cost at the lowest level possible. It aims at a rate of less than 10% of its annual income.

Staff

PlanetRomeo Foundation did not have any staff employed in 2015.

4.4 Notes to the 2016 Budget

Income

PlanetRomeo B.V. donates 10% of its annual advertisement sales revenue to PlanetRomeo Foundation. Based on this, the total donation for is expected to be € 100,000. Furthermore, PlanetRomeo B.V. makes an in kind donation to reimburse the cost involved with the Service Agreement.

Because a major fundraising campaign is planned for 2016, the expected revenue out of fundraising strategies has been estimated significantly higher than in 2015.

Overhead

As in previous years, close attention is paid to make a precise estimate on the expected overhead cost of 2016.

5.3 Accounting Policies

Statutory objectives

PlanetRomeo Foundation has its legal seat in Amsterdam, The Netherlands. Its statutory objectives are:

- a. obtaining funds for the benefit of charities including the interests of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex (LGBTI) communities, such as in the fields of education, culture, gay rights, health, empowerment and sports, as well as to support other activities that could contribute to this goal; amongst others in order to, respectively by the funds available at the disposal of the aforementioned goals, in the widest sense of the word; and
- b. carry out all that with the above - in the widest sense - is related or may be conducive thereto.

Accounting policies in respect of the valuation of assets and liabilities

The annual accounts have been compiled in accordance with the Dutch Guidelines on Annual Reporting for Fundraising Organizations (*Richtlijn 650 Fondswervende instellingen*). The accounting policies adopted for the valuation of assets and liabilities and results are based on historical costs principle. Unless otherwise stated, assets and liabilities are stated at nominal value.

Accounts receivable

Receivables are stated at nominal value. If necessary a provision for bad debts is subtracted.

Liabilities

The liabilities are stated at their nominal value.

Other reserve

The other reserve is relating to the total free capital of the Foundation taking into account the continuity reserve. In the case of discontinuation of the Foundation, the eventual positive balance will be used for purposes in line with the objectives of the Foundation.

Continuity reserve

The continuity reserve is held to ensure that the Foundation will be able to meet its future financial obligations. Therefore the continuity reserve is based on the (short term) liabilities relating to projects which are already approved by the board of the foundation but are not yet paid at balance sheet date.

Accounting policies in respect of result determination

In determining the result, revenues and expenses are allocated to the year to which they relate.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To: The Management Board of Stichting the PlanetRomeo Foundation and the Supervisory Board

We have audited the accompanying financial statements 2015 of Stichting the PlanetRomeo Foundation, Amsterdam, which comprise the balance sheet as at December 31, 2015, the profit and loss account for the year 2015 and the notes comprising a summary of the accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's responsibility

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements and for the preparation of the management board report, both in accordance with the Guideline for annual reporting 650 "Fundraising Organizations" of the Dutch Accounting Standards Board. Furthermore, management is responsible for such internal control as it determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Dutch law, including the Dutch Standards on Auditing. This requires that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error.

In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of Stichting the PlanetRomeo Foundation as at December 31, 2015 and of its result for the year then ended in accordance with the Guideline for annual reporting 650 "Fundraising Organizations" of the Dutch Accounting Standards Board.
